Silhouette of Memories is the exhibition outcome of Tweed Regional Gallery's inaugural Bundjalung award, presented to First Nations artist Michael Philp as part of the 2022 Wollumbin Art Award. Philp received the award for his painting *Pearly Shells*, 2022, which honoured his mother, aunty, and grandmother, and was the inspiration for this new body of work.

Philp's paintings in *Silhouette of Memories* kindly invite us into personal moments of a sentimental recollection. Each painting was created from a treasured memory or an old photograph and highlights Philp's strong connection to family and friends.




"This painting is of my brother Mathew, my two sisters Monica and Aileen, and a little me. It was taken from a photo of us standing in our backyard."

"My brother Mathew and I with our mum. We had just come home from school. We were all pretty relaxed and smiling so we must have had a good day at school."






"This piece is of my brother Mathew and I, standing at the backyard of my sister's house at Palm Beach."





"Taken from an old photo of my nieces and I at Kirra Beach. When we were kids, I spent a lot of time with these girls playing. It brought back good memories."




Michael Philp Sea View 2023 acrylic on canvas 91 x 122 cm

"My little cousin Graham had a nickname 'hairyman'. He had fuzzy bushy hair as a kid. As he got older, he had these ringlets. We were pretty close as kids, hanging out at our grandmother's house, getting up to mischief. It's funny these days, he's totally bald."



Michael Philp is a contemporary aboriginal artist from the Tweed Caldera. He grew up on the Tweed Coast, his mum an aboriginal woman and his father a white fisherman. Much of Michael's youth was spent at the seaside or on the river. It was a place to connect with his dad, to spend time with friends and sometimes to reflect in solitude. This coastal landscape of his childhood features regularly in his current works.

With his signature minimalist style, Michael tells the story of his people from a modern-day perspective. His work explores themes around identity, connection to land, connection to his people, and his own personal memories of his family history, within the Tweed community.

Michael started painting later in life but was recognised early on in his career with a commendation in the 2009 NSW Parliament Art Prize. His art has been exhibited in solo and group shows across NSW, including Sydney and is nationally recognised and collected.

Today, Michael enjoys giving back to the community through art workshops. He is passionate about sharing the healing power of art with others. Michael has facilitated groups at local schools, aboriginal communities, community organisations for youth, in conjunction with Lismore Regional Gallery, Northern Rivers Community Gallery, Southern Cross University and Byron School of Art.

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
