

Risk Assessment for School Visits to Tweed Regional Gallery & Margaret Olley Art Centre

INTRODUCTION

This document provides guidelines to help plan your group's visit to the Tweed Regional Gallery & Margaret Olley Art Centre. It is essential for visiting groups to prioritise the health and safety of all members. Supervisors and leaders are responsible for ensuring safe and appropriate behaviour during the visit.

Insurance: Public Liability \$20 million

Access: The Gallery has accessible facilities, including a lift and set down area close to the front doors of the Gallery, undercover parking and a bus parking area. The Gallery provides the following:

- wheelchair access to the Gallery, the Gallery Café and the facilities wheelchairs are available free of charge, and can be pre-booked by calling <u>02 6670 2790</u>
- undercover accessible parking spaces opposite the lift on the lower level

Emergencies: Emergency procedures are in place at the Gallery; Gallery employees are trained to deal with emergency situations.

First aid:: The Gallery has staff trained in first aid available at all times. First aid kits are available.

Child-rated employment: Employees and volunteers engaged in child-rated activities have current Working with children Check. Confirmation and WWCC numbers can be provided upon request.

SUPERVISION

- **Supervision Requirement:** Teachers and accompanying supervisors must oversee their students throughout the entire visit. The responsibility for maintaining control and ensuring safety of students rests with the supervising teacher or group leader. During your visit the Gallery will be open to the public, teachers and accompanying supervisors must supervise students in all areas of the Gallery to ensure student safety.
- **Pre-Visit Briefing:** Supervising teachers should ensure that all accompanying adults are familiar with the Gallery's protocols before arrival. Supervising teachers should ensure that all accompanying adults are aware that the Gallery will be open to the public and students should be supervised in all areas of the Gallery to ensure student safety.
- Medical and Behavioural Awareness: Be aware of any specific medical conditions or behavioural issues affecting
 individual group members.
- **Safety Precautions:** Take care when using the external stairs or navigating different areas of the Gallery. Ensure that group members walk in the Gallery to prevent injuries and damage to artworks.

FIRST AID

- **First Aid Provision:** The Gallery has staff trained in first aid available at all times. There is a stocked first aid kit, and a defibrillator is on-site.
- In Case of Injury or Illness: Notify Gallery staff immediately if a medical situation arises. A supervisor from the group should stay with the affected individual.

• Emergency Medical Services: For major incidents, the Gallery will call the appropriate emergency services.

FIRE SAFETY AND EMERGENCY EVACUATION

- **Emergency Personnel:** Trained Emergency Wardens and Assistant Wardens are responsible for guiding visitors and staff during emergencies.
- Emergency Exits: Clearly marked emergency exit signs are throughout the Gallery.
- **Evacuation Procedures:** Follow the instructions given by Emergency Wardens or Assistant Wardens. The group leader/supervisor must direct their group accordingly.
- Lifts: Do not use lifts during a fire emergency.

GENERAL

- Food and Drink: Consumption of food and drink is not permitted inside the Gallery. There are designated areas
 outside where school groups can eat. In case of rain, prepare for possible exposure to the elements as the covered
 areas are limited.
- Sun Protection: If bringing lunch, ensure students have hats, sunscreen, and appropriate clothing for sun protection.
- Accessibility: The Gallery is wheelchair accessible, with toilet facilities including accessible toilets available on-site.
- Clothing and Footwear: Wear suitable clothing and footwear as temperature and humidity levels are controlled.
- Public Liability Insurance: The Tweed Regional Gallery & Margaret Olley Art Centre have public liability insurance.
