# BULAAN BURUUGAA NGALI EXHIBITION

### 22 February – 27 April 2025

Bundjalung and beyond are lands steeped in complex woven histories and identities. *Bulaan Buruugaa Ngali Exhibition* shares the histories and identities of women who bring forth ancient weaving practices and knowledge systems.

Touring to three regional galleries located on Bundjalung Country, NSW (Grafton, Lismore and Murwillumbah), this ground-breaking exhibition presents new work by contemporary First Nations artists who have responded to their great grandmother's artistry of weaving.

Shown alongside historic ancestral woven objects from the Australian Museum collection, are new works by weavers Bindimu, Casino Wake Up Time, Janelle Duncan, Madeleine Grace, Lauren Jarrett, Tania Marlowe, Bianca Monaghan, Krystal Randall, Rhoda Roberts AO, Kyra Togo and Margaret Torrens that breathe new life into ancient weaving traditions.



This touring exhibition is an Arts Northern Rivers project, in partnership with Grafton Regional Gallery and presented by Tweed Regional Gallery & Margaret Olley Art Centre, and Lismore Regional Gallery. This project was made possible by the Indigenous Visual Arts Industry Support Program, the NSW Government through Create NSW, the Dobell Exhibition Grant Program, funded by the Sir William Dobell Art Foundation and managed by Museums & Galleries of NSW, and the Australian Government Regional Arts Fund.

# Painting Life: Margaret Olley and works from the collection

# **Margaret Olley Art Centre**

The Margaret Olley Art Centre (MOAC) celebrates the career, life and legacy of Margaret Olley AC (1923–2011), Australia's most distinguished painter of still life and interiors.

MOAC houses the permanent re-creation of two sections of Olley's famous home studio that was located at 48 Duxford Street in Paddington, Sydney.


To achieve this ambitious re-creation, over 21,000 objects were catalogued before being transported from the artist's home studio and installed in the purposebuilt art centre.

In Olley's paintings, we see the furniture, posters, vessels, vases, cushions, kilims and flowers — fresh, dried and synthetic — the subject matter for her still life paintings, objects that were arranged and re-arranged throughout her home studio for nearly 50 years.

A dynamic program of exhibitions and events complement the re-creation and continue contemporary explorations of the genre of still life painting and Olley's legacy in the history of Australian art.
